QuiNina J. Sinceno is a clergywoman, entrepreneur, mentor, and author who is a native of and currently resides in the metropolitan area of New Orleans, Louisiana. She is an alumnus of Destrehan High School, holds a Bachelor of Arts in General Studies with a concentration in Social Sciences from Louisiana Tech University (2011), has studied Chemistry at Grambling State University, Entrepreneurship (Executive MBA) at Tulane University, and is currently working on her Doctorate of Divinity at Slidell Baptist Theological Seminary. While attending Louisiana Tech she co-founded Women of Valor; Men of Virtue, sang in the university gospel choir Souls on Fire, taught as a campus ministry leader for Chi-Alpha, and held Early Morning Prayer for an independent cell group. Her Ministerial License was obtained at Liberty School of Ministry and Bible Institute (2013).

QuiNina has published three books personally, Rhythm of Love, SELAH: Poetry that Speaks and Life of JOY: The Key to Transformed Living and three as a publisher through her publishing company GDI Enterprises, LLC. As the owner of AgapeWear her original designs are showcased and often worn without notice.

Because of the uncertainties of uncharted territory and growing up in a religious culture where women are not equally accepted as being one whom God would choose to use as a voice QuiNina struggled and hesitated for a season before accepting her calling as a prophet in 2003. After humbly surrendering she embraced her inner boldness by deciding to have a greater desire to please God than fearing the rejections of men. Since then, she has served in multiple leadership capacities at the ministries in which she has been connected with (i.e., youth pastor, college minister, women's minister, and conference events coordinator). Under the tutelage of her spiritual parents Drs. Johnny and Pamela Drumgole of Monroe, Louisiana has served the Youth Ministry, Women of Power, Fresh Oil Fellowship and the School of Prophets. QuiNina was also afforded the privilege of doing missionary work in Ghana, Africa in 2008 where God performed many miracles for His people through the missions' team of Ruth White Ministries. Though still connected with her spiritual parents QuiNina now serves in ministry locally at Body of Christ Fellowship Church, under the leadership of Rev. John E. Dillon, Jr. of Metairie, Louisiana.

She is an advocate of faith for those who have been diagnosed with terminal/long-term illnesses by willingly and candidly sharing her testimony of overcoming the physical, financial, mental, and spiritual challenges that occur during illness as a result of being grateful to God for granting her "the strength to endure with Grace." Her focus is to minister to and empower the next generations to be all who God has created them to be without apology or compromise. Her mission is to impart healing, faith, wisdom, and joy to others.
